An African-American female NASA research mathematician from the Hampton Roads area. She made her mark in history as the human "computer" who helped send astronaut John Glenn to the moon on his orbital mission.

An US Women's Artistic Gymnast, the first African-American to win the individual all around event in the Olympics. She also won gold in the 2012 & 2016 Summer Olympics.

Ibtihaj Mohammad
